




04 Life Sciences in numbers

Significant sub-sectors: specialized manufacturing, laboratories, research and development

The **120+** companies and organizations in the sector employ more than **5,000** people.

Proportionally, there are **3 times as many jobs in the Life Sciences sector in** Laval than in Quebec as a whole, which shows the importance of the sector in Laval.

The sector is mostly made up of SMEs, but a third of the companies have 20 or more employees and 10% have a staff of 100 or more.



05 Laval's Life Sciences ecosystem

• Biotech City

- A space dedicated to the life sciences sector.
- The Institut national de la recherche scientifique (INRS) and the Centre québécois d'innovation en biotechnologie (CQIB) are both in Biotech City.
- Ensures the creation and development of companies in the LSHT sector.
- Offers specialized rental spaces and construction-ready land (100,000 sq. m. for development).

• INRS-Armand-Frappier Research Centre

- One of the 4 INRS research centres in Quebec.
- Detects, prevents and improves human, animal and environmental health.
- Contributes to research in addition to training and technology transfer.
- Centre québécois d'innovation en biotechnologie (CQIB) [Quebec biotechnology innovation centre]
 - Business incubator, accelerator and strategic partner.
 - Founded by Ville de Laval and the INRS.
 - Upcoming \$3M expansion to add 5 laboratories and a clean room.
